Middle School Supply List 2020-2021

During the 2020-21 school year, we will be limiting the number of supplies that are shared between students. Each student should bring their own set of the following materials. Individual supplies are not to be shared between students. When back-to-school shopping, have your child choose items (lunch box, water bottle, backpack, pencils, headphones) they can easily identify and label them clearly.

In addition, to avoid high-traffic indoor areas of the school, cubbies will not be available for personal school supply storage. Students should be able to fit all of their school supplies in one backpack, to remain with them most of the school day. In order to minimize physical materials, students will be receiving most of their classwork on their school computers. We are not requiring one binder/folder per class this year. We will be able to provide storage space for seasonal gear as the weather changes.

Please label all items Updates to list highlighted in green

All Students

- Face masks (enough to wash and wear a clean mask to school every day, with an extra mask to keep in backpack)
- Weather-resistant backpack with multiple compartments and a relatively waterproof bottom because it may be sitting on the ground outdoors
- One multi-subject binder (with dividers) to store a limited number of papers
- A lunch box that is easy to clean/wipe down and students are able to open themselves. *Microwaves will not be available to heat up lunches this year.*
- A reusable water bottle
- Small personal hand sanitizer (gloves optional)
- Small pack of tissues
- Seasonal gear -- certain activities will be outdoors, rain or shine, to provide mask and movement breaks every day. Please make sure students are prepared with appropriate outdoor gear each day. We highly recommend leaving a set at school:
 - Fall/spring: Boots, rain coat, sun hat or cap
 - Winter: Warm jacket, hat, gloves, scarf, snow pants
- Bug spray and sunscreen
- Now Required: Outdoor camp chair. This may be left at school but should be weatherproof so it could be stored outdoors. Seat should be light and foldable for

easy transport and storage. The height of the seat does not impact participation in class because students will be spread out. (Please note that, since spending this much outdoor time is a new experience for most students, they may change their minds about what type of seating they prefer as they try different products.) Here are a few optional accessories that may make the outdoors more comfortable:

- Optional: Canopy, sun shade, or small personal umbrella that can be clipped to a chair (no popup tents)
- Optional: Lap desk or surface for writing
